


A Rising Conference Hub

Sights: fossil remains, artefacts, paintings, jewelry, utensils and more


Adwa Victory Memorial

Sights: wildlife, aquatic animals, historical buildings, artefacts and more




Friendship Park








Tourist Spots Near Addis

While injera – a unique Ethiopian flatbread – is a staple in many households, dairy and meat products feature more prominently in the diets of nomadic and semi-nomadic communities. The cuisine of the southern parts of Ethiopia revolves around the Enset (false banana) plant, a versatile ingredient that serves as the base for numerous dishes.









